External Validation

Last week we completed our External Validation panel meeting where we met with a peer principal, a principal school liaison (principal in charge of a number of schools), our Director of Education and Learning and our school EV team, to discuss our school's progress in the areas of learning, teaching and leading. We have been working towards this submission since the beginning of the year and were able to present the panel with a comprehensive document which included our school self-assessments and supporting evidence.

Schools make judgements on key elements of high-quality practice which define the core business of excellent schools. By assessing our practice, we are able to inform our school planning and strategic directions. The panel were pleased to validate all our judgements and our proposed future directions.

In summary (this is the good part), the panel acknowledged that our school has seen incredible academic growth in our students since 2015 as our NAPLAN results show we currently sit above the state and statistically similar schools. They said our school culture is strongly focused on learning and building educational aspiration and that we should consider ourselves a 'lighthouse' school. We were also acknowledged as excelling in the areas of wellbeing, school planning, school resourcing and management practices and processes.

I look forward to sharing our 'future directions' in the next newsletter.
