#### **Stage 2 English Enrichment**

A small group of Year 3 and 4 students with high potential have been selected to complete a project that will promote an enhanced love and appreciation of reading that will be presented to their peers.

The project will be driven by the students interests and strengths and allow them to explore a range of literature and present their findings in a creative and thought provoking way through writing, art, drama, technology and oral presentations. This will be completed under the guidance of Mrs Bailey on a Wednesday.

#### **Stage 2 and 3 Mathematics Enrichment**

The stage 2 and stage 3 Mathematics extension groups will be continuing this term on a Wednesday with Mrs Bailey. The students will continue to complete practice Mathematical Olympiad style papers in preparation for their final 2 Olympiad competitions.

Students explore different problem solving strategies and work in small groups to explain their mathematical reasoning and are encouraged to show their thinking through clear working out. They will also get the opportunity to compete in the Australian Mathematics Competition in week 4.

#### **Reading Club**

Reading Club is an initiative which is research based to help motivate and engage readers. The aim of this initiative is to promote engagement in reading.

This semester we have offered Reading Club to a small group of students from years 2-5. There will be a year 2 group, a year 3 group and a year 4/5 group. The students will have the opportunity to work both individually and in their small group with our librarian, Mrs Brandt once a week for 40 minutes. During this session the students will discover new authors and broaden their reading choices with a view to encourage a further love for reading. This is not a learning support program.

Parental support is very much a part of the program and parents will be asked to help complete a reading log and comment on their child's reading habits and choices. Mrs Brandt and myself also provide feedback to teachers in order to further support our students.

We are looking forward to another successful program.

#### **WINTER MENU INFORMATION – TERM 3 2022**

An updated Winter menu was sent home to each family last week. It is also available on our school website, under 'About Our School' – Canteen. Included in the menu are any special events and the last opening day before the holidays.

Please refer to the current menu for available items and correct prices when placing orders. We have several new items on the menu. Chicken Goujon Wraps will be available on Wednesdays and Thursdays and Chicken Burgers on Fridays. Chicken Katsu & Cucumber sushi rolls have replaced Teriyaki Chicken rolls. Messy Monkey (gluten free wholegrain snacks) have replaced Mini Pops. Hot Jacket Potatoes will be available plain or with a selection of toppings.

Children are able to purchase snacks and frozen items over the counter.

Please use School24 for online orders. The cut-off for online orders is 8:30am. Please check you receive a confirmation email of your order. This confirms that the order has successfully been received by the canteen.

At certain times there may be supply issues and some items may not be available. Most times you will notice this when ordering, as the item will not be on the list. If an ordered item is no longer available, a suitable item will be offered in exchange or money refunded. Due to supply issues, lettuce is temporarily unavailable and therefore will not appear as an option when ordering online. As soon as it is available again the option will be visible on School24.
